<p>I SPY</p> <p>Give children some clues about an object in the room, and have them try to guess what you're describing. For instance, to describe a ball, you might say, "I spy something that begins with a 'b-b-b' sound. To extend, you could say it is round, and filled with air, that bounces." It is about a girl who makes different, creative sandwiches every day. It celebrates differences and encourages children to be themselves. It also encourages children to taste new things something new allows us to enjoy new things <a href="#">Carla's sandwich</a></p> <p>Make your own sandwich</p> <p>Do you know how to make a sandwich?          How many slices of bread are needed to make a sandwich?          What do you think you need to make one?          What would you like to put on it? Do you know how to use a knife (with adult supervision) to spread butter/cheese/chocolate spread?</p>	<p>Color sorting train</p> <p>Lay colored sheets of paper/card on the floor to create a color train. Go around the house and find objects that match one of the colors and put it into the train. Sort your objects according to their color.</p>  <p>How many yellow objects did you find?          Which objects are blue?</p>  <p>Extension (sharing/halving)          *Can you share the objects with one other person so you have the same amount?          * Can you share the objects with 3 people equally?</p> <p>Or</p> <p>Ten Frame Study</p>	<p>Look at the animals in this picture and think about which one you would like to have as a pet at home. Why? How would you care for it? What would it eat?</p> <p>You can also follow the instructions and color them in using the assigned colors.</p>  <p>Or</p> <p>Walking Water Experiment</p> <p>Materials: small plastic cups or glasses, food coloring, paper towels, water</p> <p>Place 7 cups in a row and pour water in the 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, and 7<sup>th</sup> cups, about ¾ full. Add five drops of red food coloring to the 1<sup>st</sup> cup and the 7<sup>th</sup> cup. Add five drops of yellow food coloring to the 3<sup>rd</sup> cup.</p>

Ten Frames are frequently used in Kindergarten.

Create a homemade ten frame to learn about composing and decomposing numbers 1-10. Use playing cards to draw numbers and place that many toys (one per square) in the ten frame.





Add five drops of blue food coloring to the 5<sup>th</sup> cup. Take a half sheet of a paper towel and fold it in half lengthwise and in half again lengthwise. Trim off some of the length so that there isn't too much excess paper towel that will tick up in the air between each cup. This will make the water walk more quickly. Place one half of a roll of paper towel in the 1<sup>st</sup> cup and place the other half in the cup next to it. Continue this until you have placed the last paper towel that drapes over from the 6<sup>th</sup> cup to the 7<sup>th</sup> cup. Watch what starts to happen! You should be able to see the colored water begin to crawl up the paper towel. Predict what will happen before and during the experiment.

4 red frogs

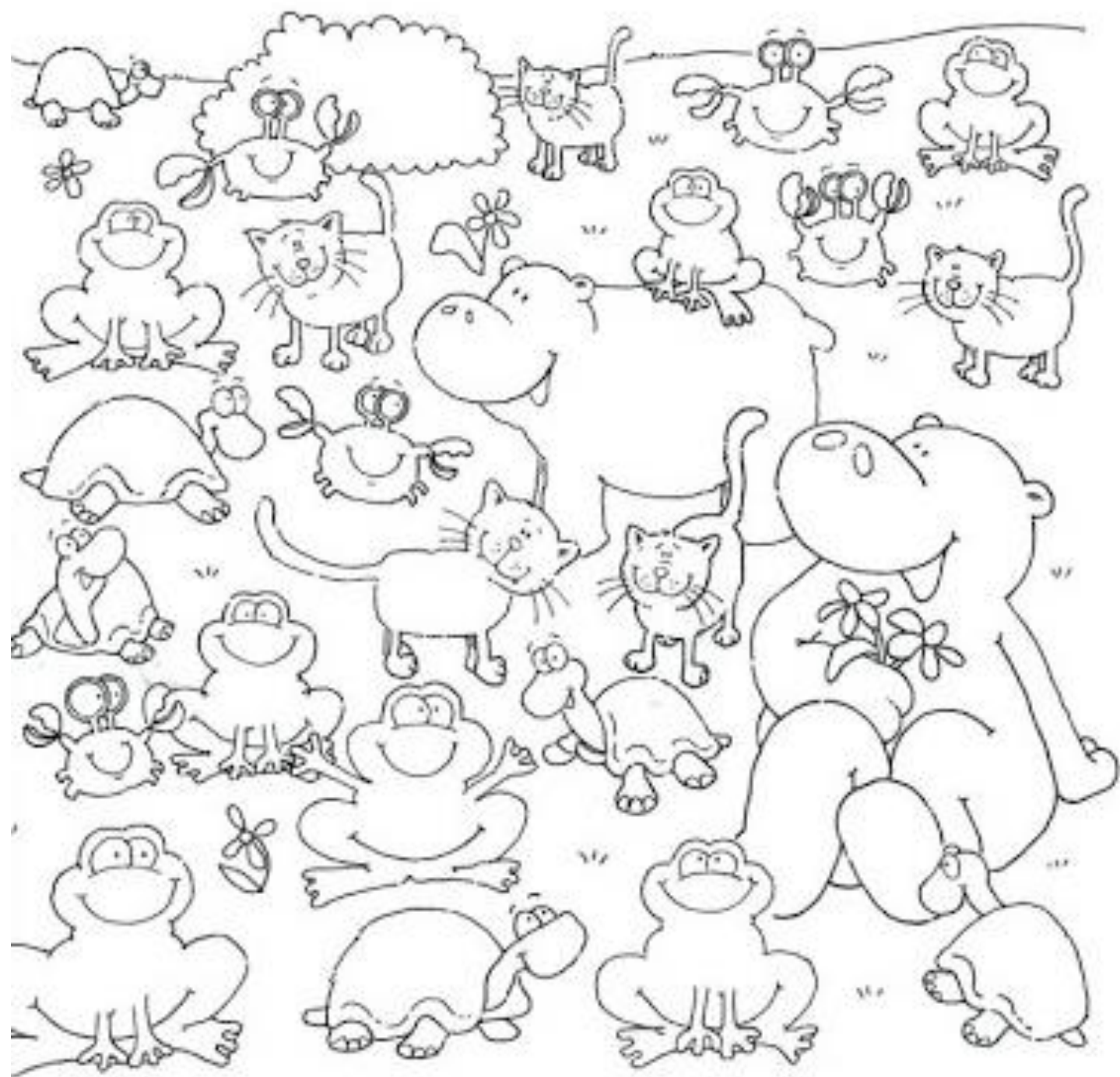
